As part of a team dedicated to the successful establishment of Trinchero's luxury wine program, Henry held successive positions as enologist, assistant winemaker and ultimately associate winemaker. From there he moved to Artesa Winery and Vineyards, where he oversaw winemaking for the acclaimed Ridgeline Vineyard. Joining Jarvis Estate in 2008 as Winemaker, Henry earned a reputation for crafting beautifully balanced, vineyard-driven wines. His work with estate-grown wines continued at Clos du Val.

"As our family celebrates 40 incredible years in Oakville and plans for an even brighter future, we're thrilled to welcome and work with someone of Ted's caliber and deep experience in Napa Valley winegrowing," Suzanne Groth said.

"I have long admired the iconic, vineyard-driven wines of Groth and the family's adherence to growing and making wines with a distinctive sense of place," Ted Henry said. "I look forward to working closely with the family and grower partners as we continue to explore all aspects of our estate vineyards and the Oakville appellation."
