

AN ESTATE-BASED WINERY

- Based in Oakville, one of the world's top Cabernet-producing regions
- Two vineyard estates:
 - Oakville: 121 acres in the heart of Napa Valley on Oakville Cross Road
 - **Hillview:** 44 acres at the base of the Mayacamas Mountains in the Oak Knoll District (Yountville)
- Fully integrated vineyard and winemaking teams work side by side throughout the seasons
- Sustainably farmed, certified by Fish Friendly Farming

SUSTAINABILITY



SUSTAINABLE PRACTICES

Practices in the vineyard and the winery consider the impact we have beyond our property borders.

- Water recycling system: Water from winemaking process goes back in ground cleaner than we got it.
- **Ultraviolet light sanitizer:** Cleans tanks without using a drop of water
- Reduced deficit irrigation:
 - Probes measure soil moisture.
 - Porometer gauges vine water stress.
 - Combination helps conserve water and improve wine quality.
- Carl Moyer Program: Upgrade to cleaner, more environmentally friendly tractors
- Fish Friendly Farming: Certified sustainable under rigorous standards





FARMING FOR THE FUTURE

Our 40-year replanting effort ensures every one of our vines is optimal for the next generation.

- New trellising: Optimizes vine growth management
- New clones and varieties: Best suited to soils and climate
 - Cabernet Sauvignon: See Clone heritage
 - Merlot: Bear Flat Clone heritage
 - Cabernet Franc: Brings new dimension for Oakcross Proprietary Red







SOIL HEALTH

"We know that taking care of our greatest assets, our vineyards, is never done." — Founder Dennis Groth

Cover crops:

- Planted to match soil type and vine performance
- Provide nutrients to soil
- Increase water-holding capacity of soil
- Include insectary rows
- Specialized farm equipment: Allows us to control weeds without using herbicides
- Partial no-till soil management:
 - One side of vine disced; other left as grass
 - Improves soil organic matter and conserves water
- Fallow blocks: Restoration of soil health before replanting
- Annual compost applications
- Sheep: Graze down cover crop and provide fertilizer







ALL ABOUT THE DIRT

We are responsive to the vineyards, allowing them to dictate what and how we farm.

A deep dive block by block:

- Enhanced Vegetation Index (EVI):
 - Provides vigor measurements
 - Helps to understand relative health of vines
 - Offers guidance for precise picking
- **Soil pits:** Provide a deeper understanding of soil and root health







INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT

An environmentally sensitive approach to pest management

Some examples:

- Mealybug pheromone tags: Disrupt mating
- Rootstock selections: Provide pest resistance
- **Insectary garden and rows:** Attract beneficial bugs that prey on pests
- Owl boxes, raptor perches and bluebird boxes: Help naturally control gophers and insects







WINE QUALITY

Continual improvement through incremental advancements in technology, equipment and process

- **Basket press:** Gentle pressing preserves flavors and aromas
- Mechanical sorter: Along with hand sorting, ensures only highest-quality fruit makes it into our wines
- Automated cap management: Provides consistent pumpover regime
- Cigare barrels and stainless-steel barrels:
 Provide more lees contact, giving the wine more richness and creamy texture



2021 ESTATE WHITE

In 1994, the Groth family replanted the Eastern side of their Oakville vineyard from Cabernet Sauvignon to Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon, recognizing the potential of the clay soils there to produce white wines of great texture, depth and complexity. This bottling marks the first Groth white wine grown exclusively on the family's Oakville Estate.

Each vintage, the blend for this wine is guided by the conditions of the growing season and our winemakers' intuition.
